yard in Nottinghamshire, was Young Riders Silver medallist 2002. In 2005 he made his British Senior squad debut (individual) at the 2005 European Championships. Since then he has regularly competed and at Burghley, Badminton, Blair Castle and Ballindenisk.

Commenting on Matthew's application, Stephen Renouard, Equestrian Director of Express Eventing, said: "We are delighted that Matthew has applied to the Express Eventing Qualifier in his home turf. The calibre of applications for all four Qualifiers is extremely high and, as such, speaks volumes for the trust and belief the riders have in this thrill- a-minute version of the sport."

The Express Eventing Series 2011 rolls out at four Qualifiers – Bolesworth, Lincolnshire, the CLA Game Fair at Blenheim and The Festival of British Eventing at Gatcombe - this summer and culminates in the Final at the Horse of the Year Show at Birmingham's LG Arena in October.

Mitubishi Motors Badminton Horse Trials winner Mark Todd will be vying for a place at the Express Eventing Final when he competes against the likes of Oliver Townend, winner of the inaugural Express Eventing in 2008, and three times winner of the Hickstead Eventing Grand Prix Gary Parsonage at Bolesworth Showjumping Classic.

The Express Eventing Series 2011 will consist of three arena-based disciplines: 'dressage to music', cross country and showjumping, carefully organised within the schedules of the three Qualifying and Final shows.

The Express Eventing Series will have a total prize pot of £100,000 with approximately £60,000 being allocated to the Qualifiers and £40,000 to the Express Eventing Final at the Horse of the Year Show.

- The Lincolnshire Show, Lincolnshire Events Centre, on 22 June
- The CLA Game Fair, Blenheim Palace on 24 July
- The Festival of British Eventing, Gatcombe Park, 7 August

The Express Eventing Final takes places at HOYS on 4 October 2011.
